



# BEDFORD EULESS ROAD RECONSTRUCTION

**STARTING  
Q3 2022**

The City of North Richland Hills (NRH) will soon begin a much-needed reconstruction of Bedford Eules Road spanning a half mile from Booth Calloway Drive (Painted Tree) to just east of Strummer Drive (Sushi Axiom). Reconstruction is anticipated to begin in Q3 of 2022 and last for approximately 18 months, depending on weather conditions. This project is a part of the 2020 Street Bond proposition that passed with 79% voting in favor to reconstruct 27 streets in NRH.

## PROJECT SPECIFICS

- The current asphalt road is to be replaced with reinforced concrete.
- Bedford Eules will go from a four-lane road with a two-way left turn lane to a two-lane road with a two-way left turn lane.
- The southern curb line will be shifted north to accommodate a new 6-foot sidewalk.
- Construction will be phased.
- Businesses will maintain driveway access at all times unless coordination is made and agreed upon between the contractor and the business and/or the property owner.




Current Road Condition

## ADDITIONAL DETAILS

- Should unforeseen events occur that necessitate one-way traffic, proper notice will be given. Public Works will make every effort to avoid these situations.
- For businesses that have multiple driveways, there may be times where only one point of access is available.
- The Boulevard 26 intersection and the intersection east of Strummer Drive will still flare out to the current lane configuration.
- A crosswalk will be added just West of Colorado Boulevard to cross Bedford Eules Road.
- The project also includes storm drainage improvements for improved drainage during and after rain events.
- A parallel 8" waterline is proposed to be constructed within the Southern parkway.
- A sidewalk connection from Booth Calloway to Boulevard 26 is also proposed.
- Crews from Atmos may be on site for utility relocation prior to commencement of the city's street construction. Should you have issues with your gas, please contact Atmos at 888-286-6700.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### How was Bedford-Eules Road chosen as a project?

With street improvements identified as a top priority in recent citizen surveys, a committee of 35 residents from across the city met from October 2019 through February 2020. They considered several factors when prioritizing and recommending projects including existing pavement conditions, traffic volumes, maintenance records, input from citizens surveys and estimated costs.

### Who approved this project?

NRH citizens who voted for the 2020 Bond Proposition that passed with 79% voting in favor to reconstruct 27 streets in NRH; Bedford Eules Road is one of the 27 streets in the approved Bond package. The project was advertised for bidding in March 2022 and awarded at City Council on April 25, 2022.

### Why is this project necessary?

This section of Bedford-Eules has deteriorated to a point that the roadway is failing in many locations resulting in low friction factors, potholes, surface cracking, and ponding water.

### Why is Bedford Eules Road going from a four-lane to a two-lane road?

The need to make room for a sidewalk along the south side of Bedford Eules while traffic studies show that this configuration is appropriate for current and future traffic patterns.

### Who is managing the project?

The project is being managed by the city's Public Works department. Kimley Horn and Associates, Inc. is the engineering firm and the construction firm is Quality Excavation, LLC.

### How long is the construction project going to take?

Construction is expected to take approximately 18 months, weather permitting. Project milestones are in place to motivate the contractor to complete construction on time. Quality Excavation, LLC successfully completed the 2018 Smithfield Road project on time.

### Where and in which direction is construction going to take place?

The order and sequencing of work will be determined by the contractor.

### Will my business have access during construction?

Yes, you will have access to your business at all times. For businesses that have multiple driveways, there may be times when only one point of access is available.
